

Mr. Warner, from a select committee, reported favorably upon the Senate bill entitled, An act to indemnify and protect John R. Kenly and George R. Dodge, successive provost marshals in the city of Baltimore and the police force under their command, from all prosecutions for acts done in the discharge of their official duties;

Mr. Johnson, of Baltimore county, from a select committee, reported the Senate bill entitled, An act to amend the 20th article, of the Code of Public Local Laws, by repealing the 32, 33 and 37th sections thereof, and substituting and adding the following sections in relation to the town of Easton, in Talbot county, with amendments;

Mr. Price, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably upon the Senate bill entitled, An act to authorise the county commissioners for Prince George's county, to levy and appropriate money for the payment of witnesses for the defence in criminal cases;

Also, upon the Senate bill entitled, An act to refund to Rebecca T. Neill a certain sum of money therein named, paid to her for composition on a patent granted to her for certain lands in Baltimore county;

Which were severally read the second time.
