Ordered, That each officer of the Senate and House of Delegates be paid by the certificate of the Chairman of the committee on Claims, the sum of fifty dollars, for extra services, except in cases now provided for;

On motion of Mr. Duvall,

Ordered, That the Chairman of the committee on Claims be directed to settle the several accounts against Tobacco Warehouse, No. 2, and reported favorably upon by the committee on Inspections.

Mr. Dunbar submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Governor be requested to have the Flag hoisted over the Capital, daily, during the recess of the Legislature, provided the present war may continue so long.

Mr. Chamberlain proposed the following order:

Ordered, That the Chairman of the committee on Claims is hereby authorised to issue his certificate for six days per diem for such members of the late Legislature as were present during the two days of the extra session of that Body, at its September session, at Frederick, and, also, to such members as were engaged on committee on Engrossed Bills, and officers who were required to attend and witness the signing of the Laws, for such sum as the committee may allow.
