ably upon the Senate bill entitled, An act to appropriate a sum of money to John M. Brewer, late Reading Clerk of the Senate, at Frederick;

Which report was received, and

The bill laid on the table.

The Secretary of the Senate returned:

The House bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 387, 388, 389, 396 and 397, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and substitute and add the following;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendments," viz:

Amend section 1, by striking out, in line 1, the figures, "396 and 397," and inserting after the figures "388," the word "and:"

Strike out the whole of section 4, sub-section 4 and section 5;

Amend the title by striking out, in the 2nd line, the words "three hundred and ninety-six and three hundred and ninety-seven," and inserting after the words "three hundred and eighty-eight," in line 1, the word "and;"

Amend sub-section 2, by adding thereto the following:

"Provided, that nothing herein contained shall require grain to be inspected, but that it shall be optional with the seller to have his grain inspected or not, under the law, as he may desire;"
