39; bill from the Senate, 80; read first time and referred to, 87.

An order that the, correspond with the Governor of Massachusetts, in reference to the families of those killed in the Baltimore riot of 19th April, with a view, &c.

Communication from chaplain of the Third Regiment Maryland Volunteers, respecting the condition of the families of the State volunteers, referred to, 62; bill reported for the relief of families of Maryland volunteers, read first time, 203; proceedings, 291, 292, 301, 302; read by special order and passed, 303; bill mislaid in the Senate, proceedings on, 371; new bill, proceedings on, 390; read third time and passed, 462.

Leave granted the, to introduce a bill for the relief of volunteers now in the field or in preparation for service, 63; read second time and amended, 261, 62, 63.

Report stating the embarrassing nature of the duties of the, their inability to make a final report before next session, their intention to introduce a bill for the relief of our volunteers, and to introduce resolutions embodying the spirit of the bill, 100; resolutions introduced and passed, 105.

Leave was granted, to bring in a bill to compensate that portion of the Sixteenth Regiment Maryland Militia which, in obedience to an order from Governor Hicks, performed guard duty at Frederick, 157; was read the third time and passed, 831.
