

SHARPSBURG TURNPIKE COMPANY—Bill reported favorably, to amend the charter of the Hagerstown and, passed January session 1853, read first time, 387.

SHEEP—Senate bill, to repeal sections 118, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, of article 12, of Public Local Laws, relating to, 590; reported favorably, 610; read third time and passed, 833.

SINKING FUND—Report of the committee on Finance of the Senate, and Ways and Means of the House, &c., read and ordered to be entered on the Journal, 115.

SLAVERY—Joint resolutions, remonstrating against the agitation of the subject, of the relation of master and servant within the District of Columbia, 460; read the second time and passed, 475; returned from Senate endorsed, 615; amendments, which were adopted.

SOMERSET COUNTY—Leave granted the committee on the Judiciary, to introduce a bill extending jurisdiction of justices of the peace in, 39; read first time, and by special order, and passed, 159; returned from Senate rejected, 207.

Leave was granted delegation from, to bring in a bill to repeal the 137th section, of 19th article, of Public Local Laws, relating to the register of wills for, and to substitute, 148; read first time, and referred to committee on Judiciary, 170; proceedings on, 188, 189.

Leave granted, to report a bill allowing Joshua W. Phillips, former sheriff and collector of taxes in, further time to complete his collections, 243; reported and read first time, 248; read second time, 261; read third time and passed, 313.

Leave granted, to report a bill to change the name of Mary Brittingham of, to that of Mary Sterling, 252; reported, 260.
