

Mr. Davis, of Montgomery county, submitted the following:

Resolved, That the thanks of the Legislature of Maryland are due and are hereby tendered to Lieutenant John H. Russell, a native of Montgomery county, in this State, for his gallantry and daring in running into Pensacola harbor directly under the guns of the enemy, and firing and destroying the rebel pirate Judith;

Which was read the first, and, by special order, the second time.

Mr. Warner offered as an amendment:

“That in connection with the name of Lieut. Russell, that of Lieut. John Glendy Sproston, of the city of Baltimore, be associated; and that this General Assembly highly appreciate the conduct and success of Capt. Hugh Y. Purviance, a citizen of Baltimore, of the United State Ship St. Lawrence, in his attack and destruction of the privateer Petrel, of the so-called Southern Confederacy;”

Which was adopted.
