

member of the same, in turn, an opportunity during the day to vote at his proper election precinct, whenever, in the judgment of such person in command, this can be done without jeopardizing the public peace, or of affording an opportunity for creating disorder, or for a violation of law by such temporary diminution of his command.

22. No member of the police force will be allowed to make or to solicit from others, contributions for political purposes.

23. Every member of the force shall at all times carry with him a memorandum book, on which he shall enter, as soon as practicable after the occurrence, the names of all persons taken into custody by him, and the nature of the charges preferred against them, with such particulars as will be important at the trial of the case, especially noting the names of the witnesses present when the alleged offence was committed. Their books will be furnished by the Board, and must always be open to the inspection of any officer of higher rank, and returned as other public property when the party quits the service, or at any time when demanded by the Marshal, Deputy Marshal or a Captain of Police.

24. Every member of the police force will be required to pay prompt obedience to every order that may be given to him in the name of the Board of Police, by the President or President *pro tem.* of the Board.

25. Any officer may, if he deem the occasion to require it, suspend any subordinate in rank to himself for disobedience of orders, or gross neglect or violation of the rules and regulations; such suspension shall as soon as practicable be reported, if made by the Marshal or Deputy, directly by the Marshal to the Board, and if made by any other officer, to the Captain on duty at the station house of the district to which the party suspended was attached, together with the reasons for such suspension. Such report will, without delay, be transmitted to the Marshal, and by him to the Board.—An officer or policeman whilst under suspension must not wear his uniform. Any officer or policeman specially detailed to command a party may, for like causes, suspend any one of the same, or of a subordinate grade, who is under his orders, and shall make in the same manner a report of his proceedings.

26. Each officer and policeman will have assigned to him a separate number, to be worn at all times on the cap when in uniform; such number indicate no permanent superiority of rank, and they may at any time be changed, as the Board may direct. But as it is desirable that, at all times, when two or more are acting together, some one of them shall, in order to prevent confusion, be responsible for their action, and should consequently have for the time being the right to give all necessary directions to the others, the following rules are prescribed, viz., Every officer and policeman will at all time
