When, however, any person arrested may be under examination, all persons whom the Police Justice, the party who made the complaint, or the accused, may desire to be examined as witnesses, shall be called in; and the Captains will also admit such friends of the accused, to a limited and not inconvenient or unreasonable extent, as the latter may desire to be present,

7. It shall be the especial duty of Captains, as of all other Officers, to see that their subordinates adhere strictly to the regulations respecting cleanliness and neatness of uniform and of person, and to report in writing to the Marshal all violations of the same.

8. The captains will cause the Men of their respective commands to be divided into such number of Platoons and Sections as the Marshal shall direct, and designate the proper Officers to command the same; and see that such Officers properly discharge their duties.

9. They shall see that all the members of their commands, are thoroughly instructed in their duties, and are acquainted with the nature and extent of the powers delegated to them respectively.

10. The roll shall be called at the station-houses, at the commencement and at the termination of each hour of active duty; and the Captains will cause the Men, as their Names are called for Patrol Duty, to arrange themselves in line, that they may be inspected by the Sergeants.

11. The Captains shall divide their respective Districts, with the sanction of the Marshal, into proper number of patrol beats, both for day and night, and designate the Men for patrol duty therein and the Sergeants to command them. The beats shall be numbered, and records of the same, and of the names of the Sergeants and Men assigned to each, be kept at the station-houses.

12. When any person is brought to a station-house charged with any offence against the laws, the Captain on duty will ascertain from the party making the charge, whether the alleged act constitutes an offence for which a person may lawfully be detained, and whether there is reasonable ground for supposing that it was committed by the party accused. If satisfied on these points, he will cause the party to be detained in custody at the station-house, until the case be acted on by the Police Magistrate. If the party has been arrested under a regular warrant, he will in all cases be detained until the case is thus acted on. All persons who may be legally remanded for a further hearing, or finally committed, the Captain will cause to be safely escorted, and delivered, with the proper order of commitment, to the custody of the Warden of the City Jail.
