(A) POSITION.

THERE IS AN ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE STATE, AS PROVIDED IN ARTICLE V, § 1 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION.

(B) SALARY AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS ENTITLED TO:

- (1) THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET; AND
- (2) REIMBURSEMENT FOR TRAVEL AND OTHER EXPENSES THAT ARE CONNECTED WITH THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE.
