(b) Whenever the county commissioners proclaim the adoption or rejection of code home rule status, they shall send notification promptly to the following State agencies:

(b) Copies of this compilation shall be made available for inspection at the office of the board of county commissioners during normal business hours; and copies shall be kept on permanent record at the office of the board of county commissioners. Copies also shall be furnished to the [Hall of Records Commission] STATE ARCHIVES, TO the State Law Library, and to each member of the legislative delegation of the county. The foregoing copies shall be furnished without charge, and the county also may make other copies available at a reasonable cost to any person.

Article 33 - Election Code

When a board is required by law to transfer documents to the [Hall of Records] STATE ARCHIVES, the board shall make and keep a record indicating the nature of the documents and identifying the documents for retrieval purposes. A copy of this record shall be filed with the State Administrative Board of Election Laws.

3-14.

(b) The boards shall retain all old registration books or forms which have been transcribed onto new forms under this section for a period of at least five years. At the expiration of the five-year period, the boards shall transfer old registration books or forms [either] to the State Administrative Board of Election Laws for delivery to the [Hall of Records or to a local historical depository] STATE ARCHIVES.

(c) Each board shall retain cancelled registration records in its office for a period of five years, open to public
