

(A) [The annual budget for Washington County, as] AS submitted to the [Board of] County Commissioners, THE ANNUAL BUDGET shall have a figure for the total of all proposed appropriations and a figure for the total of all estimated revenues available to pay the appropriations. The figure for total proposed appropriations may not exceed the figure for total estimated revenues.

(B) [The Board in] IN amending the budget bill, THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS may not cause the figure for total proposed appropriations to exceed the figure for total estimated revenues, including any revisions, and in the budget as enacted, the figure for total estimated revenues always shall be equal to or exceed the figure for total appropriations.

(C) The only surplus of unexpended funds which can be used to balance the annual budget is a surplus confirmed by audit. (8-45B. County Budget Requirements. 1976, ch. 231.)

Code Supplement

8-46. Publication.

The County Commissioners [of Washington County] shall have prepared and published, or contract for the preparation and publication, of a supplement to or new edition of the Code of Public Local Laws of Washington County. The supplement or new edition shall be published in 1976 or before and at intervals of no less than four years after that date. (1975, ch. 248, sec. 8-43.)

(1) The Board of County Commissioners of Washington County was authorized to issue bonds as follows: 1931, ch. 135, \$45,000. for Sharpsburg school; 1931, ch. 386, \$10,000. for Sandy Hook school; 1933, ch. 9, \$55,000. for Sharpsburg and Sandy Hook schools (and this Act also repealed ch. 135 and ch. 386 of 1931); 1936 Sp. Sess., ch. 150, \$135,000. for Sharpsburg, Morgansville, Sandy Hook and Mt. Lena schools (and this Act also repealed ch. 9 of 1933); 1937, ch. 452, \$190,000 for Williamsport High School, Woodland Way Junior High School and South Potomac Junior High School; 1939, ch. 363, \$400,000. for a court house building and/or jail, this Act being defeated by a vote of 1865 "For" and 9052 "Against" at a referendum election on November 5, 1940 (see 1941 Session Laws, p. 2072); 1941, ch. 200, \$200,000. for National Defense Training Center Building and the Hancock Elementary School; 1947, ch. 632, \$1,500,000. for the Washington Street Junior High School, the North Street High and Elementary School, and other schools; 1955, ch. 392, \$8,000,000. for building and equipping schools; 1961, ch. 905, \$1,000,000. for office facilities (amended by ch. 20, 1st Special Session of 1962); 1961 Special Session, ch. 11, \$750,000. for junior or community college buildings; 1963, ch. 690, \$9,000,000 for schools; 1967, ch. 352, \$10,000,000. for schools.
