CHAPTER 309

(Senate Bill 149)

AN ACT concerning

Pensions - Part-Time Service

FOR the purpose of providing that a member of the Employees' and Teachers' Retirement System whose medical disability prevents full-time work may receive full service credit for the part-time service in the computation of the member's retirement allowance or benefit under certain circumstances; providing for an exception; providing that a member of the Employees' and Teachers' Retirement System who qualifies and elects for a full service credit for regular part-time service in the computation of the member's retirement allowance or benefit shall contribute a certain amount to the Annuity Savings Fund; providing for the applicability of this Act under certain circumstances; and generally relating to part-time service of members of the Employees' and Teachers' Retirement System.
