and when due and until paid in full, such principal to be discharged within fifteen years of the date of issue of the bonds.

- (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth in Section 1 (3) above, the Center for the Handicapped, Inc. shall provide at least an equal and matching fund of \$300,000. No part of an applicant's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. The Center of the Handicapped Inc. have until June 1, 1986 to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, 1986 the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in Article 78A, Section 3 of the Code.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1984.

(Senate Bill 1032)

AN ACT concerning

Dorchester County - Palm Readers - Licensing

FOR the purpose of altering the licensing fee for persons carrying on the business or practice of palmistry and certain related businesses and practices in Dorchester County.
