

of an applicant's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the board's decision is final. The County Executive and County Council of Baltimore County have until June 1, 1986, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, 1986, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in Article 78A, § 3 of the Code. Furthermore, the County Executive and County Council of Baltimore County shall grant and convey a perpetual preservation easement on the exterior and interior of the structures, where appropriate, and on the land to the Maryland Historical Trust, in form and substance acceptable to the Trust.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1984.

CHAPTER 495

(House Bill 1674)

AN ACT concerning

Bail - Subsequent Offenders

FOR the purpose of providing that a person charged with causing abuse to a child under 18 while the person has been released on bail or on the person's own recognizance for committing a certain crime is ineligible to give bail or be released on the person's own recognizance on the subsequent charge of causing abuse to a child under 18; providing for a certain rebuttal; and generally relating to bail for subsequent offenders.
