[This title does not limit the right of an individual to practice a health occupation that the individual is authorized to practice under this article.]

- (A) REGISTRATION WITH THE BOARD IS REQUIRED FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS ENTERING--THE--PRACTICE--OF PRACTICING ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AFTER JULY 1, 1984.
- (B) ALL INDIVIDUALS CURRENTLY REGISTERED BY THE BOARD OF SANITARIAN REGISTRATION WILL BE RECOGNIZED AS REGISTERED ENVIRONMENTAL SANITARIANS AFTER JULY 1, 1984.
- ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AFTER JULY 1, 1984 AND WHO MEET THE EDUCATIONAL AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 5.5-302 AND WHO HAVE NOT OBTAINED THE NECESSARY EXPERIENCE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO FULFILLING THE EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS UNDER RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD TO INSURE PROPER SUPERVISION AND PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC BY INDIVIDUALS PERFORMING THE DUTIES OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH PRIOR TO BEING REGISTERED.
- SHALL STATE THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH AN INDIVIDUAL CURRENTLY PRACTICING, BUT WHO FAILS THE EXAMINATION FOR REGISTRATION, MAY CONTINUE TO PERFORM THE DUTIES WHILE AWAITING REEXAMINATION.
- (C) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY MAY, BY JULY 1, 1985, WAIVE THE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE FOR AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED BY THE OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT:
