~~(e) -- The applicant shall pass a written examination given by the Board. The examination shall be in the basic sciences that relate to environmental health.~~

To apply for certification, an applicant shall:

(1) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires; and

(2) Pay to the Board an application fee [of:

(i) \$10 for certification as a sanitarian in training;

(ii) \$15 for certification as a registered sanitarian, if at the time of application the applicant is a sanitarian in training; or

(iii) \$25 for certification as a registered sanitarian, if the applicant is not a sanitarian in training] TO COVER THE ACTUAL COST OF EXAMINATIONS AND THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES.

(a) An applicant who otherwise qualifies for certification is entitled to be examined as provided in this section and [§§ 17-302, 17-303, and 17-306] § 5.5-302 of this subtitle.

(b) The Board shall give examinations to applicants at least once a year, at the times and places that the Board determines.

(c) The Board shall notify each qualified applicant of the time and place of examination.

(d) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, the Board shall determine the subjects, scope, form, and passing score for examinations given under this subtitle.
