Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- (b) Whenever a law-enforcement officer is under investigation or subjected to interrogation by a law-enforcement agency, for any reason which could lead to disciplinary action, demotion or dismissal, the investigation or interrogation shall be conducted under the following conditions:
- The law-enforcement officer under investigation informed in writing of the nature of the investigation shall be prior to any interrogation. Upon completion of the investigation, the law-enforcement officer shall be notified of the name of charges and specifications against the officer witness and all not less than ten days prior to any hearing. IN ADDITION, LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER UNDER INVESTIGATION SHALL BE FURNISHED WITH A COPY OF THE INVESTIGATORY FILE, EXCLUDING THE IDENTITY OF CONFIDENTIAL SOURCES, ANY INFORMATION WHICH WILL NOT BE USED IN THE UPCOMING HEARING, AND RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO CHARGES, DISPOSITION OR PUNISHMENT, NOT LESS THAN 10 DAYS BEFORE ANY HEARING IF THE OFFICER AND THE OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVE AGREE:
- (I) TO EXECUTE A CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT WITH THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO NOT DISCLOSE ANY OF THE MATERIAL CONTAINED IN THE RECORD FOR ANY PURPOSE OTHER THAN TO DEFEND THE OFFICER; AND
- (II) TO PAY ANY REASONABLE CHARGE FOR THE COST OF REPRODUCING THE MATERIAL INVOLVED.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1984.

CHAPTER 661

(House Bill 934)

AN ACT concerning

Workmen's Compensation - Group Self-Insurance

FOR the purpose of providing that to qualify as a group proof of an annual gross premium of a certain amount must be provided to the Workmen's Compensation Commission; requiring the Workmen's Compensation Commission to provide for certain competitive advance premium discounts net--te--exceed--a certain-percentage-of-the-standard-premium; requiring a
