AN ACT concerning

Developmentally Disabled Persons - Respite Care

FOR the purpose of expanding the maximum days of respite care available, subject to certain circumstances; defining certain terms; and clarifying certain provisions.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 88A - Social Services Administration

- [(a) In this subtitle, the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) "Respite care" or "respite care services" means short-term care, including in-home care, of individuals with developmental disabilities, including the provision of temporary relief of the individual or the individual's family, on a planned or out-of-home basis or in a time of crisis. State-funded respite care programs may not exceed the following limits within a fiscal year:
- (1) In-home temporary care by trained personnel on an hourly basis; and
- (2) Out-of-home temporary care provided by trained personnel in a respite care center on an hourly basis for up to 24 hours, and, in addition, on a 24-hour basis, including overnight accommodations, for a maximum period of 7 continuous days.]
