- (A) "RESPITE CARE" MEANS SHORT-TERM CARE OF AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY WHICH IS PROVIDED EITHER WITHIN OR OUTSIDE THE INDIVIDUAL'S HOME FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING TEMPORARY RELIEF TO THE INDIVIDUAL OR TO THE FAMILY.
- (B) SUBJECT TO THE APPROPRIATION PROVIDED FOR THIS PROGRAM IN THE STATE BUDGET, RESPITE CARE FOR ONE INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT EXCEED THE FOLLOWING LIMITS WITHIN A STATE FISCAL YEAR:
- (1) UP TO A TOTAL OF 24 HOURS OF CARE WHICH IS PROVIDED IN PERIODS OF LESS THAN 10 HOURS IN ANY 24-HOUR PERIOD; AND
- (2) UP TO 14 DAYS OF CARE A "DAY" BEING DEFINED FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION AS NO FEWER THAN 10 NOR MORE THAN 24 HOURS IN ANY 24-HOUR PERIOD.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1984.

CHAPTER 725

(Senate Bill 475)

AN ACT concerning

Developmentally Disabled - Definition

FOR the purpose of expanding the definitions of "developmentally-disabled" "respite care" or "respite care services" and --- "nonretarded --- developmentally --- disabled individuals with certain illnesses and injuries under the certain services that the State provides to certain disabled individuals.
