

(II) IN SUCH CASES THE PEOPLE LICENSED SHALL BE UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF LOCAL BOARDS.

(3) PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES, REGULATED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, WHEN ENGAGED IN DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND MAINTENANCE OF COMPANY OWNED AND MAINTAINED EQUIPMENT ON THEIR PREMISES OR ON OTHER PREMISES, ROADWAYS, AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY WHERE THEY HAVE A LAWFUL INTEREST;

(4) THE SALE OR INSTALLATION OF ANY FINISHED PRODUCTS, MATERIALS, OR ARTICLES OR MERCHANDISE WHICH ARE NOT ACTUALLY FABRICATED INTO AND DO NOT BECOME A PERMANENT FIXED PART OF THE STRUCTURE OR PREMISES; OR

(5) ANY PERSON WHO FURNISHES MATERIALS OR SUPPLIES WITHOUT FABRICATING OR INSTALLING THEM PERMANENTLY INTO THE STRUCTURE OR PREMISES, OR CONSUMING THEM IN THE PERFORMANCE OF WORK AS A CONTRACTOR.

(1) THE BOARD CREATED BY THIS SUBTITLE IS A PART OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATION. THE EXERCISE OR PERFORMANCE OF ALL POWER, AUTHORITY, DUTIES, AND FUNCTIONS VESTED IN THE BOARD UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY OF THE SECRETARY OF LICENSING AND REGULATION AS SET FORTH UNDER ARTICLE 41 OF THIS CODE, OR ELSEWHERE IN THE LAWS OF THIS STATE.

(2) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE REVENUES OF THE BOARD CREATED BY THIS SUBTITLE BE SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE COSTS OF ITS ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING REASONABLY APPORTIONED DEPARTMENTAL OVERHEAD. THE SECRETARY OF LICENSING AND REGULATION SHALL MONITOR FEES AND REVENUES FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THIS INTENT AND RECOMMEND ADJUSTMENTS WHENEVER NECESSARY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason, the invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end all the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1984.
