

modifications made by the Secretary must be presented to the Administrative, Executive, and Legislative Review Committee for review and approval prior to the effective date, and the Secretary must submit legislation containing these exceptions or modifications to the next regular session of the General Assembly following the date on which the exceptions or modifications become effective.

SECTION -2- 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1984.

response--account;~~ providing for the listing of proposed controlled hazardous substance sites; providing for certain criteria for a hazardous substance response plan; providing for a disposal site registry; prohibiting judicial stays of certain orders of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to suspend or revoke the permit of a controlled hazardous substance facility until the exhaustion of certain judicial appeals concerning the order; and generally relating to cleanups for controlled hazardous substance spills in the State and staying of an order to suspend or revoke a permit of a controlled hazardous substance facility until the exhaustion of certain judicial appeals.
