WHEREAS, Forest management is recognized as a desirable means of protecting and enhancing the forest resource; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day will be celebrated with a number of activities across the State that relate to tree planting and forest conservation; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly believes that these activities and programs are vital to the future of the State's forest resources; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor is requested to designate 1984 "The Year of the Forest" to promote the State's forest resources, to support the cooperative efforts of public agencies, private organizations, and industry, and to expand public awareness of Maryland's forests; and be it further

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Medical Transplant Study Commission
