

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor is requested to appoint a board to meet regularly to review and make recommendations regarding issues which require interagency coordination involving all facilities which provide domiciliary care; and be it further

RESOLVED, That in addition to its other activities, the board should develop coordinated standards for resolving problems involving community responses to facilities which provide domiciliary care; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the board be composed of the following members:

- (1) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene;
- (2) The Secretary of Human Resources;
- (3) The Director of the Office on Aging;
- (4) The Secretary of State Planning;

(5) One Two consumer member members, of whom one shall be a representative of the Maryland Advocacy Unit for the Developmentally Disabled; and

(6) Any other members the Governor considers to be appropriate for the Board; and be it further
