Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 893.

This bill establishes a maximum number of tax sales certificates that may be included in a single bill of complaint if more than one property owner is involved.

Senate Bill 710, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 8, 1984, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 893.
