This bill adds Baltimore County to those counties where gaming activities are allowed to be conducted by various nonprofit organizations for their direct benefit.

Senate Bill 40, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 29, 1984, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 992.

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County - Gaming Activities

FOR the purpose of including Baltimore County among those counties where certain organizations or corporations may conduct or hold carnivals, bazaars, or raffles for certain purposes, subject to certain restrictions; removing Baltimore County from the application of a certain provision of law concerning gaming activities; providing that a certain provision of law concerning gaming activities applies to certain organizations in Baltimore County;
