

This bill allows certain restaurants in Garrett County to serve alcoholic beverages on Sundays between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m., subject to certain restrictions; and alters the alcoholic beverages fee for restaurants serving alcoholic beverages on Sunday. This bill requires approval of its provisions by the qualified voters of Garrett County in a referendum at the general election held in November of 1984 before its provisions become effective.

Senate Bill 635, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 8, 1984, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 1237.

House Bill No. 1237

AN ACT concerning

Garrett County - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses

FOR the purpose of allowing certain restaurants to serve alcoholic beverages on Sundays between certain hours in Garrett County subject to certain restrictions; altering the alcoholic beverages fee for restaurants serving alcoholic beverages on Sunday; providing that this Act is subject to the approval of the voters of Garrett County; and generally relating to serving alcoholic beverages on Sunday in Garrett County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages  
Section 98A  
Annotated Code of Maryland  
(1981 Replacement Volume and 1983 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

98A.

(A) In Garrett County, notwithstanding any other provisions of this subtitle EXCEPT THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, and except on Sundays and New Year's Day, holders of any
