- (5) Each of the inmates is scheduled for mandatory discharge by operation of law between December 23, 1983 and May 31, 1984; and
- (6) The release of these inmates would not be contrary to the public safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HARRY HUGHES, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, having thought proper the extention of clemency in the following cases do hereby pursuant to the authority invested in me by law, grant unto the following persons a COMMUTATION of the remainder of their sentences as imposed for the offenses indicated:
