

Chapter 641 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1983  
Section 3

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

18.

(o) (7) By July 1, 1983, licensees under this section shall implement the privileges conferred by this license and be in full operation. Also, at [the] THAT time a licensee shall have a minimum of \$10,000 beer, wine and liquor in stock.

(1) (2) Any hotel meeting the minimum requirements of subsection (aa) may elect to be issued a license under that subsection, or any bona fide hotel may elect to be issued a license under this subsection if it: (i) is an establishment for the accommodation of the public providing service ordinarily found in hotels, (ii) is equipped with not fewer than 25 rooms, a lobby with registration and [wall] MAIL desk, seating facilities and a dining room which serves full-course meals at least twice daily and which has a regular seating capacity at tables (not including seats at bars or counters) for 50 or more persons, and (iii) is operated in a physical plant which has a valuation for purposes of State and local assessment and taxation of not less than \$20,000 and which has a valuation of personal property for purposes of State and local assessment and taxation of not less than \$3,000. This license in a hotel does not permit sales at bars or counters, or sales for consumption anywhere except on the premises on which the meals are prepared and served.

20.

(h-2) (5) The license shall be issued only to the following clubs and organizations:

(v) A racquetball club, regardless of whether the club is operated for profit, that has 75 or more bona fide members paying dues of not less than \$50 each per year, which has at the time of application and continues to maintain a minimum of 6 racquetball [courts] COURTS, with facilities for preparing food. No license may be issued if the licensee is within 300 feet of any existing licensed establishment of any kind.
