administration and enforcement of the alcoholic beverage laws in Wicomico County. For the purposes of the alcoholic beverage laws, the part-time inspector shall have all the powers of a peace officer or sheriff of the State of Maryland. He shall make oath faithfully to perform the duties entrusted to him, as provided in Article I, [§ 6] § 9 of the MARYLAND Constitution [of Maryland]. The part-time inspector shall furnish a bond in the amount of \$2,000 to the board of license commissioners and Wicomico County, jointly, conditioned that he will well and faithfully execute his office in all things pertaining thereto. The cost of the bond shall be paid by Wicomico County.
