- (3) The Superintendent shall designate an individual from the Department to serve as director of the program, and shall provide appropriate support services to the program from existing budgets.
- (4) Financial assistance shall be given in accordance with a sliding payment scale established by the director.
- (5) The director shall review on an annual basis the eligibility of individuals receiving financial assistance.
- (b) (1) The director shall [insure] ENSURE that at any given time at least 50 percent of the individuals receiving financial assistance under the program are:
 - (i) Gainfully employed; or
 - (ii) Actively seeking employment.
- (2) The remainder of the eligible disabled individuals assisted under this program shall be individuals who currently:
- (i) Reside in a nursing home or similar institution licensed to provide chronic or intermediate care and who will be deinstitutionalized as a result of this program; or
- (ii) Are on an approved waiting list of an institution.
- (c) Financial assistance provided under this program may not duplicate any [assistance provided by:
- (1) The Adult Protective Services Program mandated by Article 88A of the Code; or
- (2) The Medicaid Personal Care Program mandated by this article.] OTHER STATE OR FEDERAL ASSISTANCE FOR ATTENDANT CARE THAT THE ELIGIBLE DISABLED INDIVIDUAL IS RECEIVING.
