one of his deputies to act as county jailer in Somerset County; repealing a provision relating to the minimum annual salary for the county jailer; and providing for a delayed effective date for this Act.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings Section 2-309(u) Annotated Code of Maryland (1984 Replacement Volume and 1984 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

2-309.

- (u) (1) (I) The Sheriff of Somerset County shall receive a salary of not less than \$16,000 and no expense allowance. He shall appoint a chief deputy who shall receive a salary of not less than \$7,500. Subject to the approval of the County Commissioners, the Sheriff may appoint additional deputies at the compensation set by the County Commissioners prior to any appointment. [The Sheriff or one of his deputies shall act as county jailer and shall receive annual total compensation of not less than \$6,000.]
- (II) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL APPOINT A JAIL WARDEN AS THE COUNTY JAILER. PRIOR TO THE APPOINTMENT OF ANY INDIVIDUAL, THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL ESTABLISH AN ANNUAL RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR THE COUNTY JAILER.
- (2) The Sheriff and his deputies may wear uniforms when performing their official duties, and the automobiles used by the Sheriff's office shall be equipped with a two-way radio.
- (3) The County Commissioners may pay for the uniforms, radios, automobiles, and operating expenses of the automobiles of the Sheriff's office.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect December 1, 1986.
