CHAPTER 120

(Senate Bill 639)

AN ACT concerning

Criminal Injuries Compensation Act

FOR the purpose of providing that certain individuals who are victims of a federal crime committed in this State may compensation under the Criminal receive Injuries Compensation Act under certain conditions; elarifying -- that compensation -- is -- awarded - for - psychological - injuries - as - well as-physical-injuries; clarifying that compensation may be awarded for funeral expenses and lest-wages mental health counseling; authorizing the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board to waive the ineligibility of certain family members to receive compensation under certain conditions; providing for reassignment of cases by the chairman; making certain technical stylistic changes; generally relating to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act; and providing for the effective date and applicability of this Act.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
