- 3. 12 months of experience, acceptable to the Board, in the field of environmental health; or
  - (iii) A baccalaureate degree that includes:
- 1. 30 semester credit hours or the equivalent in quarter units in the natural sciences that meet the education standards set by the Board;
- 2. A course in mathematics and at least 1 laboratory course in 3 of the following fields: chemistry, physics, microbiology, and biology; and
- 3. 24 months of experience, acceptable to the Board, in the field of environmental health; or
- (iv) A master's degree in public health or environmental health science that includes:
- 1. 30 semester units or 45 quarter units of basic sciences that meet the educational standards set by the Board;
- 2. A course in mathematics, and at least laboratory course in 3 of the following fields: biology, chemistry, physics, and microbiology; and
- 3. 3 months of internship approved by the Board if not previously completed; or
- (2) The applicant has at least 10 years of experience in the field of environmental health that meets the standards set by the Board.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an examination given by the Board under this subtitle.]

To apply for [certification] LICENSURE, an applicant shall:

- (1) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires; and
- (2) Pay to the Board [an] THE REQUIRED application AND EXAMINATION fee [to cover the actual cost of examinations and the issuance of certificates] SET BY THE BOARD.
