SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Family Law

4-501.

- (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) (1) "Abuse" means any of the following acts committed by a household member against another household member:
  - (1) and act that causes serious bodily harm;
- (2) (II) an act that places another in fear of imminent serious bodily harm; or
- (3) (III) [sexual] abuse of a child, as defined in Title 5, Subtitle 9 of this article.
- PROHIBIT REASONABLE CORPORAL PUNISHMENT, IN LIGHT OF THE AGE AND CONDITION OF THE CHILD, FROM BEING PERFORMED BY A PARENT OR STEPPARENT OF THE CHILD.
- (c) "Court" means the District Court or a circuit court in this State.
  - (d) "Family home" means the property in this State that:
- (1) is the principal residence of the household members; and
