Preamble

The General Assembly finds that:

- (1) This State has a duty to locate and protect children who are reported missing;
- (2) The number of missing children has increased, and this problem requires a statewide system for exchanging information, a central repository for information on missing children, and special training for law enforcement personnel;
- (3) The first 24 to 48 hours after a child is reported missing are crucial, and law enforcement agencies responsible for investigating reports of missing children should establish procedures to begin an investigation as soon as a report is received; and
- (4) Children, parents, educators, and others should be educated about child protection; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
