ALL AGREEMENTS TO PAY COMPENSATION TO RECOVER OR ASSIST IN THE RECOVERY OF PROPERTY MADE WITHIN 24 MONTHS OF THE DATE THE PROPERTY IS PAID OR DELIVERED TO THE ABANDONED PROPERTY DIVISION ARE UNENFORCEABLE UNLESS THE COMPENSATION TO BE PAID IS 20 PERCENT OR LESS OF THE PROPERTY TO BE RECOVERED.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1985.

CHAPTER 603

(House Bill 299)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Consumer Protection Act - Civil ~~Penalty~~ Penalties

FOR the purpose of altering the civil ~~penalty~~ penalties for a violation under the Maryland Consumer Protection Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Consumer Protection Act.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Commercial Law

13-410.

(a) A merchant who engages in a violation of this title is subject to a fine of not more than [\$300] \$1,000 for each violation.
