SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 10 - Attorneys at Law and Attorneys in Fact

(d) (1) The Court of Appeals shall prescribe rules for a uniform system of bar examination in this State, for registration as aforesaid, for character examination of each applicant, for admission to the bar[;], and for the fees to be paid by the applicant[;] and generally such other rules as may be necessary or convenient to carry out the provisions of this section. Every applicant upon presenting himself or herself for examination before the Board of Law Examiners, shall pay to the Board such fee, not exceeding \$50, as may be fixed by the Court of Appeals.
