5-203.

All fees collected under the provisions of this subtitle shall be placed in a fund, known as the "Pesticide Fund," and used to defray partially the expenses of administering this subtitle. Any unexpended funds shall revert to the [general funds] GENERAL FUND of the State at the end of the fiscal year. 6-103.

Registration fees constitute a special fund to be used only to defray partially the cost of inspection, sampling, analysis, and other expenses necessary for administering this subtitle. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Code, any unexpended funds up to a maximum of \$100,000 may not revert to the [general

funds] GENERAL FUND of the State at the end of the fiscal years.
