{A} -- A WORK PLAN FOR THE EVALUATION OF EXISTING REGULATIONS BY THE UNIT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMITTEE BY SEPTEMBER 31, 1985, AND EVERY 5 YEARS THEREAFTER, BY EACH OF:

{1} -- THE PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH, AS LISTED IN § 8-201 OF THIS ARTICLE, AND

{2} -- THE FOLLOWING UNITS OF STATE GOVERNMENT:

{I} -- THE OFFICE ON AGING,

{II} -- BLIND INDUSTRIES AND SERVICES OF MARYLAND,

{III} -- STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION,

{IV} -- ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF ELECTION LAWS,

{V} -- HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITIES SITTING BOARD,

{VI} -- STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION,

{VII} -- MARYLAND COMMISSION ON HUMAN RELATIONS,

{VIII} -- STATE LOTTERY AGENCY,

{IX} -- NORTHEAST MARYLAND WASTE DISPOSAL
AUTHORITY,

{X} -- OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER,

{XI} -- BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS, AND

{XII} -- THE VETERANS' COMMISSION.

{B} -- THE WORK PLAN SHALL INCLUDE:

{1} -- PRELIMINARY PLANS FOR EVALUATION PROCEDURES TO BE USED BY THE PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT OR UNIT IN EVALUATING ITS EXISTING REGULATIONS,

{2} -- AN ESTIMATE OF THE SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED EVALUATION OF, AND SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS TO, THE EXISTING REGULATIONS EVALUATED,
