

(3) IN DETERMINING WHETHER TO IMPOSE A FINE, THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE VIOLATION, THE DELETERIOUS EFFECT OF THE VIOLATION ON THE COMPLAINANT, ANY GOOD FAITH ON THE PART OF THE LICENSEE, AND THE LICENSEE'S HISTORY OF PREVIOUS VIOLATIONS.

(4) THE COMMISSION MAY ASSESS A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE COMMITTED BY A PERSON OTHER THAN A LICENSEE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1985.

(House Bill 286)
