SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 81 - Revenue and Taxes

76.

- (g) The following expenses relating to the sale shall be allowed, all of which shall be liens on the property to be sold:
 - (1) The expense of publication of all notices.
- (2) The cost of the county or city surveyor's description and plat, if necessary.
- (3) A fee to the attorney representing the county treasurer for services, not exceeding fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each property; except that in Baltimore City or any county which has a paid full-time solicitor, counsel or attorney, this fee shall be collected and paid into the general funds of the city or county.
- (4) The auctioneer's fee, which in no case shall exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) for any day when one, two or three properties are sold; and for any day when four or more properties are sold the fee shall be three dollars (\$3.00) for each property sold. However, in Dorchester and Wicomico counties the auctioneer's fee shall be \$10 for each property sold, but in no event shall the auctioneer's fee be less than \$50 per day or greater than \$200 per day. IN QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY THE AUCTIONEER'S FEE SHALL BE \$7.50 FOR EACH PROPERTY SOLD.
- (5) In Baltimore County, where provision has been made for the posting of the premises to be sold, a sum not in excess of seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50).
