A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

## Nutrition Surveillance

FOR the purpose of requesting the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to establish study the feasibility of establishing a Nutritional Surveillance Program to study the nutritional and health status of residents of the State, and improving information-on-the-nutritional-status-of-the-residents; making certain cost determinations; requiring the Secretary to report certain findings and recommendations to the General Assembly by a certain date; and generally relating to a Nutritional Surveillance Program in the State.

WHEREAS, The objective of a nutritionally healthy citizenry is a high priority for the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, A nutritional monitoring system is a basic tool necessary to examine the linkage between food consumption patterns, nutritional status and health status; and

WHEREAS, There is a lack of essential information available on the nature and scope of nutritional deficiencies in Maryland,
