WHEREAS, The waiting lists for residential facilities and day activity programs for these populations are expected to grow at an estimated average rate of 240 and 330, respectively, per year; and

WHEREAS, The MRDDA has documented the identity and needs of people currently awaiting these services; and

WHEREAS, Many of those on the waiting list are in critical need of placement because parents who are in their sixties and seventies can no longer manage to care for the handicapped family member: and

WHEREAS, Program expansion to respond to the magnitude of the waiting list has been limited because there is no plan to identify and secure the required financial resources; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Department of Budget and Fiscal Planning is directed to develop and submit to the General Assembly by November 1, 1985 a 5-year plan, beginning with fiscal year 1986, to see the necessary fiscal resources 1987, to identify the level of fiscal resources necessary to implement the plans for program expansion as prepared by the Mental Retardation and Developmental Disability Administration and as such plans may be amended from time to time; and be it further
