This bill provides minimum sentences for certain subsequent convictions for certain alcohol related driving offenses.

House Bill 245, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 28, 1985, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 32.
