- established, the form of its organization, and a reference to any determination of its tax-exempt status or change in its tax-exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code. A copy of the determination shall be filed with the statement;
- (5) The names and addresses of its officers, directors, trustees, and principal salaried executive staff officers;
- (6) Its balance sheet, income and expense statement, and a financial report (including the kind and amount of its gross income raised, costs and expenses incidental to the fund-raising activities, and the allocation and disbursement of gross income raised) prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for its most recently fiscal year.

In the event that:

- (i) The total amount of gross income received equals or exceeds \$100,000 an audit is required by an independent certified public accountant according to the standards of accounting and fiscal reporting for voluntary health and welfare organizations;
- (ii) The total amount of gross income received is less than \$100,000 the Secretary of State may require an audit as required in subparagraph (i).
- (iii) An audit required by subparagraph (i) or (ii) above may exclude funds received from a governmental agency if audit of such funds is otherwise provided by the governmental agency.
- (7) Whether it intends to solicit contributions from the public directly or have the solicitations made on its behalf by others;
- (8) Whether it is authorized by any other governmental authority to solicit contributions;
- (9) Whether it is or has ever been subject to an order of any court or administrative agency restraining or restricting its fund-raising activities, and, if so, such information pertaining thereto as the Secretary of State may require;
- (10) The purpose or purposes for which the contributions to be solicited will be used;
- (11) The name or names under which it intends to solicit contributions if different from that given pursuant to paragraph (a)(1) of this section;
