In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1290.

This bill improves the safety of children by requiring the licensing of certain facilities as group day care centers and authorizes the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt certain rules and regulations.

Senate Bill 546, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 28, 1985, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 1290.

Child-Care-Facilities Group Day Care Centers - Licensing

FOR the purpose of improving the safety of children by requiring the licensing of certain facilities as group day care centers; authorizing the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt certain rules and regulations; authorizing the -exchange--ef-certain-reports-and-records-on-child-abuse and-neglect-among-certain-licensing-and-regulating-State--or local--agencies--under--certain-circumstances; and generally relating to the licensing of child-care-facilities group day care centers.
