In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1506.

This bill provides that certain individuals who are victims of a federal crime committed in this State may receive compensation under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act under certain conditions.

Senate Bill 639, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 21, 1985, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 1506.
