  - (A) CERTIFIED ASSESSMENT EVALUATOR.

THE SALARY SCHEDULES SET FOR ASSESSORS UNDER § 2-109 OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL PROVIDE AN APPROPRIATE INCENTIVE TO ENCOURAGE ASSESSORS TO ACHIEVE THE DESIGNATION OF CERTIFIED ASSESSMENT EVALUATOR.

(B) COUNTIES PROHIBITED FROM PROVIDING INCENTIVES.

A COUNTY MAY NOT PROVIDE A SALARY SUPPLEMENT OR ANY OTHER FRINGE BENEFIT FOR AN ASSESSOR.
