Since the secretaries of some principal departments only have revisory power as to regulations of units, in this subsection, the words "and its units" are added to clarify that the Secretary adopts the regulations of the Central Collection Unit and any other units in the Department.

(C) CITIZENS' ADVISORY UNITS.
