I hereby Certify that negro Betty who calls herself Betsy Hawk kin, the bearer here of a light mulatto woman about thirty five years of age five feet two and a half inches high with a small scar on the left hand above the last joint of the thumb which appears to have been occasioned by a burn, also a small mole on the upper lip near the left nostril. That the said negro Betty is a free woman and was set free by Samuel Sprigg of the County aforesaid by a Deed of manumission duly acknowledged & recorded among the Land Records of Prince Georges County aforesaid on the twenty first day of April 1828.
